You Help Bring New Plans for Water Transportation



Boston Harbor Now completed its Comprehensive Water Transportation Study this year with 2 business plans for new ferry routes that can be implemented in the next 5 years.

Recent developments around the harbor have led to an increase in transportation demands. Residents, workers, and visitors want to connect between waterfront neighborhoods.

Thanks to the support of stakeholders and donors like you, Boston Harbor Now completed the multi-year project to study water transportation around the harbor. The business plans detail how to establish regular service, recommend routes, suggest vessels, and project ridership with fare options.

A New Place to Gather on Spectacle Island

Boston Harbor Now and our partners at the Department of Conservation and Recreation added 2 new shade structures to Spectacle Island this summer with funding from the City of Boston Community Preservation Act (CPA).

Each summer, over 5,000 youth visit Spectacle Island for educational programs.

These tents provide a space to gather and learn about nature, as well as to keep cool in the shade while waiting for the ferry.
