The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court
(2023-2024)**

An Act to promote nature-based approaches for resiliency and climate change adaptation throughout the Commonwealth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any special act, law or regulation to the contrary, research
2 activities and demonstration projects related to Nature-Based Approaches and implementation of
3 Nature-Based Approaches, specifically designed to study or demonstrate the efficacy of Nature-
4 Based Approaches and systems designed to enhance wave and energy attenuation, or mimic
5 natural systems for the sole purpose of developing resiliency strategies and implementing
6 Nature-Based Approaches, may be reviewed and approved in a timely manner by the authorities
7 with jurisdiction over said activities, conditioned as appropriate, with the discretion to waive any
8 and all performance and regulatory standards, provided that protections are upheld for
9 Indigenous groups and cultural and historic resources, in order to fulfill the goal of conducting
10 research and demonstration projects to inform future resiliency strategies and to implement
11 Nature-Based Approaches throughout the Commonwealth. Demonstration projects shall consider

12 protections for underserved communities and environmental justice populations when designing
13 and implementing said projects.

14 SECTION 2. This Act shall sunset five years from the date it is enacted.
