In 2024, Boston Harbor Now took bold steps to shape a future where Boston Harbor truly benefits everyone. 
FREE + REDUCED-ACCESS PROGRAMS SERVE OVER 40,000

NORTH AMERICA'S FIRST LIVING SEAWALLS

Through Boston Harbor Now's role as a co-lead of the Stone Living Lab, we were excited to celebrate the Lab's installation of North America's first Living Seawalls installation, which provides a habitat for marine life, filters and cleans water, and helps to green Boston Harbor's gray infrastructure. The Lab also brought climate science to life through its excellent 2025 conference, its annual Summer Teacher Institute that has now reached 5,000 students, and many other research and education projects—including several Wicked High Tide events, which provide hands-on education about rising seas and their impact on our waterfront communities.


